



## **Education & Training Options**

- Students should consider careers they are interested in and find the education or training solution that meets the career qualifications
- Every pathway has options for education & training
  - Apprenticeship or Career Training Program
  - A year of training (diploma or certificate)
  - Two-year degree
  - Four-year degree
  - Graduate Study

### Develop a Four-Year Plan

- Four-Year Plan is an outline of the classes to be taken each year of high school.
- Keep track of your plan.
- Include all high school graduation requirements.
- Review education/training program admission requirements.
- Align your career pathway with your four-year plan.
- Work with your school counselor each year.

## **Optimum Preparation**

Subject Area	Optimum Years	Sample Courses
English/ Language Arts	4 years	advanced composition, speech, communication, journalism
Math	4 years	algebra, geometry, trigonometry, calculus, stats
Science	4 years	biology, earth science, chemistry, physics (with lab)
Social Studies	3 – 4 years	geography, U.S. history, world history, government, economics
World Language	4 years	any one language
Electives	1 – 3 years	Fine/performing arts, computer science/technology, CTE (business, family/consumer science, industrial tech, ag)



## Character Education "People Skills"


- Being articulate, well-dressed and professional, with the ability to present themselves and their ideas to a group, are skills everyone should possess

  - Decorum and respect


## **Money Management**

## SP<sup>3</sup> – Student Planning Pointers for Parents

- Email service for parents of students in 8<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- The email service is designed to help parents and their students plan for education and training after high school by:
  - Giving timely information based on the grade of the student and time of the year
  - Helping prompt conversations between parents and students about preparing for life after high school
- How It Works
  - Register at <u>www.SP3.org</u>
  - Receive two emails per month on relevant topics
  - Use the tools and tips with your student
  - Be entered into quarterly drawings for 529 colleges savings plan deposits (40 winners of \$250 deposits each quarter)




